e-Park / Center City Parking Program

- Partner with private facilities to market short-term public parking
- Capital program to install 25 dynamic, static and garage signs at 6 facilities with 4,500 stalls

Sound Transit Light Rail Station Area Parking

- Focused on access to rail system not new park-and-rides
- Intent to install new street parking regulations to prevent transit riders from using parking needed by local residents and businesses



Light Rail Restricted Parking Zones

- Extensive outreach to plan for RPZs around each of the 5 stations
- Pilot program for business employee permits
- On-going monitoring
