- Omaha is at a defining moment due to the convergence of several factors:
- Recent years brought a significant amount of development and reinvestment in the downtown area - Last year, Omaha Metro launched the first BRT line (ORBT) along Dodge and Douglas Streets
- Significant long range planning efforts, including MetroNEXT, ConnectGO, and Heartland 2050 are all underway
